FGP202200106 Minutes - To approve and sign the minutes of the F & GP meeting on 16th November 2022

Resolution: Minutes were agreed as a true record. One abstention.

FGP202200107 Receive an update on actions – The following actions were outstanding:

ACTION: TORs are being updated.

ACTION: Clerk to produce summary of the grievance policy actions for Mayor.

The Clerk has started the appraisal process. The Heritage project fundraising will be led by the Chamber in order to achieve maximum matched funding. Work to the lampposts has been instructed. An invoice has been received from Castle Water for Church St Public toilets but not yet for the Croft Field.

FGP202200108 Consider all Committee budgets and Precept request for 2023-24 (refer to draft) and. propose recommendations for Full Council.

WBC has advised that the central charge for lamppost maintenance is unlikely to drop as the reduction in numbers will be offset by the increase in energy costs. 23 lampposts have been upgraded to LED for adoption by WBC. The Police have warned us not to expect the usual £1,000 donation for our CCTV next year. The office will keep a log of how much it is used by the police. The Clerk advised that the skate park camera is old and may need replacing soon. £6,000 will be put in the flowers budget to cover the cost of watering the tubs. Money in existing EMR (for the rail station) is to be reallocated to an R&A environment budget. After considerable discussion and various adjustments to the spreadsheet,
